Matthew 5:7-12

REVIEW OF PART 1 (Matthew 5:1-6)

- The Greek word for "blessed" is the word μακάριος (makarios). It literally means to be "enlarged."
- Last week's BIG IDEA: Before we can be blessed by God, we must first be broken before God.

1. God's kingdom is for the <u>HELPLESS</u> (v.3)

• If you don't think you need help from God, you'll never experience heaven with God.

2. God's kingdom is for the <u>HURTING</u> (v.4)

• If you've never been broken, you have no need for a comforter.

3. God's kingdom is for the <u>HUMBLE</u> (v.5)

• If you seek your reward now, you'll miss the greatest reward forever.

4. God's kingdom is for the <u>HUNGRY</u> (v.6)

• If you try and fulfill yourself with the things of the world, you'll never truly be satisfied.
