## “When the Saints Sin”

Matthew 18:15-20

**Today’s BIG IDEA:**

***When we’re wounded by other believers, Jesus provides a path to reconciliation.***

1. A \_\_\_\_\_ **PREREQUISITE** to confronting  
**sin** (v.15a)  
(Matthew 5:23-24)

2. A \_\_\_\_\_ **PROCESS** for confronting  
**sin** (v.15b)

- *The purpose of confronting sin should always be repentance and restoration, not revenge or rejection.*

Step #1 – Individual \_\_\_\_\_ (v.15)

Step #2 – Group \_\_\_\_\_ (v.16)

Step #3 – Churchwide \_\_\_\_\_ (v.17a)

Step #4 – Indefinite \_\_\_\_\_ (v.17b)  
(1 Corinthians 5:5; 2 Corinthians 2:6-11; 2 Thessalonians 3:14-15)

- *Jesus still loved Gentiles and tax collectors and sought to reach them with the gospel.*
