Today’s BIG IDEA:

Those who walk in the joy of Jesus will not walk in the shadow of Judas.

1. A question of _____ (v.14-16)
(Matthew 10:4; John 12:4-6)

- Judas was no longer interested in following Jesus. He was only interested in how he could use Jesus.
- When the cost of following Jesus is weighed against the “benefits” of not following him, many of us are tempted to make a deal.

2. A question of _____ (v.17-19)
(Matthew 26:2)

- Judas went out of his way to betray Jesus, but the other men in this passage went out of their way to obey him.

3. A question of _____ (v.20-22)
(1 Corinthians 10:12-13a)

- The root of Judas’ betrayal lies within each one of us.

4. A question of _____ (v.23-25)
(John 13:26-29)

- Judas wasn’t condemned just because he betrayed Jesus. He was condemned because he never truly surrendered to Jesus.
- Our perspective of Jesus determines our response to Jesus.
